As we know in the military community, suicide rates after returning from active duty is at an all-time high. There are currently 22 veteran suicides a day. As many know, PTSD is a large factor in this equation. One thing that gets overlooked in the professional mental health arena is that veterans need to have a purpose, a mission if you will. Veterans spend their entire careers being molded for a mission. Once their time in service ends, they lose that thing that separated them from the rest of society. For these brave men and women the mission is over and they are adrift.

This is where Mission America comes into play. Mission America's sole purpose is to eradicate Child and Human Trafficking. We utilize prior military personnel to investigate trafficking leads and providing intelligence to law enforcement agencies. Currently, global human trafficking is a \$150 Billion dollar industry. 1.2 Million children are sold around the world annually. The United States is responsible for roughly 350,000 of those children. This makes the U.S responsible for over a 3rd of the global problem. A child is sold in the U.S every 2 minutes. This is unacceptable in the greatest country in the world.

Ask Me What NFRW Stands For

The National Federation of Republican Women Stands for Ending Human Trafficking

Human trafficking is modern day slavery. It exists in the shadows but has infiltrated every community in the U.S. and globally.

Human trafficking involves sex trafficking and labor trafficking, also known as peonage. It is tied to illicit drugs and pornography; it is a reason for the disappearance of many runaways and a cause of kidnappings. Human Trafficking is facilitated by a porous border with Mexico. Human traffickers are infiltrating the foster care system. Pornaddicted adults are more likely to be involved in some form of sex trafficking. The advancement of smart technology and internet access has caused an explosion of human trafficking as "buyers" shop online.

The National Federation of Republican Women advocates preventing human trafficking

as a long-standing top priority. Our engaged membership helped enact the Justice for Victims of Trafficking Act in 2016 and the Fight Online Sex Trafficking Act in 2018. To continue the multi-pronged fight against the lucrative worldwide criminal operation of human trafficking into 2022, the NFRW advocates passing the following bills to reduce human trafficking and help its victims:

End Child Trafficking Now Act, \$ 903, introduced by Sen. Marsha Blackburn (TN), would require DNA testing to verify the relationship between an alien and accompanying minor being brought across the border without documentation, and criminalize the recycling of minors – children being used by nonparent or guardian aliens to enter the United States on more than one occasion.

Reducing the Demand for Human Trafficking Act of 2021, H.R. 332, introduced by Rep. Adam Kinzinger (IL), focuses on reducing demand for human trafficking by giving preference in grant funding under the Trafficking Victims Protection Act to programs that include a focus on investigation and prosecution of those who solicit or purchase commercial sex.

End Banking for Human Traffickers Act, H.R. 808, introduced by Rep. Brian Fitzpatrick (PA), increases the role of the financial industry in combating human trafficking via illicit money laundering.

Exposing the Financing of Human Trafficking Act, H.R. 233, introduced by Rep. Bryan Steil (WI), amends the Trafficking Victims Protection Act to hold foreign countries accountable for their efforts to investigate, prevent, and prosecute financial criminal activities associated with human trafficking.

The NFRW encourages all members of Congress to co-sponsor these important bills.



MAMIE EISENHOWER LIBRARY PROJECT (MELP)

The Mamie Eisenhower Library Project (MELP) is the NFRW's oldest program, celebrating 60 years of book donations from an approved list to schools, libraries, hospitals and other public institutions.

In 1961, the NFRW established the Mamie Eisenhower Library Project as a memorial honoring the former Republican First Lady who served for decades as a military wife and prepared the family home for over 30 moves during President Eisenhower's military service to our country. Born in lowa and moving to the South as a child, Mrs. Eisenhower was active in financial decisions in her home and often said that a woman's independence was based upon her own ability to save money. She practiced fiscal responsibility as a First Lady, often clipping recipes for the White House Chef to prepare using boxed cake mixes as they were cheaper than baking from scratch.

Each biennium, the NFRW Literacy and Education Committee compiles a list of books that reflect Republican conservative beliefs of self-reliance, freedom and independence. In 1992, tapes and videos were added to the list. In 2020, DVDs and streaming services were added to the list. These books, both adult and children's levels, are intended to be donated to public libraries, all schools, and hospitals to provide reading material to a wide variety of children and adults in our communities. During the COVID-19 pandemic, many clubs expanded to reading children's books online through social media to a nation's children not able to enter school buildings.

Club participation in the Mamie Eisenhower Library Project is one of the requirements for receiving the NFRW Achievement Awards, which are given out at NFRW's biennial convention.
